Ipswich nurse excels in improving emergency practices

A gradate nurse at Ipswich Hospital, Ms Ingram demonstrated leadership and dedication to improving conditions within the operating theatre during emergency situations.

Committed to providing the best possible care to patients, Ms Ingram has been commended by her colleagues for initiating new procedures to improve emergency situations, and championing excellent nursing assessment, hand hygiene and surgical safety.

"Working during an emergency situation presents many challenges, especially as a new graduate. After doing a bit of research I discovered that we could be more innovative in our approach," said Ms Ingram.

"Improving patient care is something I'm passionate about. To me, small changes can make a big difference. If every team member knows exactly who is responsible for performing each role during emergency situations, then it will result in better patient outcomes and more efficient responses.

"As a recent graduate, I want share my newly found skills and knowledge to improve patient care and encourage colleagues to follow correct procedures."

Taking an active role within the team, Ms Ingram has also been recognised for her collaborative approach to communication, especially during a crisis.
