Search for Australia's best early childhood educators begins

If you know an outstanding early childhood professional who deserves recognition, now is the time to nominate them for the 2018 HESTA Early Childhood Education & Care Awards.

The Awards recognise early childhood educators and carers – working with children from birth to eight years of age – who demonstrate innovation, quality improvement and enhanced learning outcomes for young children in a variety of settings including preschool, long day care, primary school or outside of hours care.

Nominations for the awards are being sought from employers, colleagues and families and are open until Friday 29 June.

HESTA CEO, Debby Blakey, said early childhood education and care professionals play a pivotal role in supporting young children learn, grow and develop.
